### From Karla Temple...

Great is Thy Faithfulness

"Great is Thy faithfulness, morning by morning new mercies I see. All I have needed, Thy hand hath provided. Great is Thy faithfulness, Lord unto me."

I thought I fully trusted in God's faithfulness before, but now, on the other side of a life-altering experience, I feel that I have truly experienced that faithfulness on a new level.

As most of you know, on December 7, 2010, I received a kidney transplant after a slow decline of my kidney function over the last few years. Of course, when I first began dealing with the options of dialysis and transplant, the normal fears and uncertainties were there. I knew I did not want long-term dialysis, after having watched my dad live with it for 6 years prior to his transplant. I also knew the transplant process can take a very long time. As my family and I, as well as many of you, prayed about my health and peace of mind, I began to experience a deep peace in a way I had never known. I was completely sure that, no matter the outcome, I was going to be all right.

As we all know, waiting is not a pleasant experience. That was probably the most difficult part of the journey. There was always uncertainty about the timing: Would I need dialysis prior to the transplant, or could we do the transplant before dialysis was necessary? I don't know why I was so surprised and amazed when the first donor to go through all the testing was a match! I was certain that God would work out all the details in His time, but I didn't realize it would be so soon! Ultimately, God's timing was perfect. I praise Him for an amazingly quick recovery and renewed strength! It is such a wonderful feeling to live each day without being completely exhausted and run down.

I would like to leave you with a passage of Scripture that has been a great comfort to me through this journey. Isaiah 43:1b-3a says: "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have summoned you by name; you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and when you pass through the rivers, they will not sweep over you. When you walk through the fire, you will not be burned; the flames will not set you ablaze. For I am the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior."

## Quilt and Blanket Blessing

**March 13**

The Annual Quilt and Blanket Blessing is Sunday, March 13, 2011, in all three services. After the new coverlets are blessed, the quilts, blankets, and afghans will be given to Project Linus, Louisville Chapter. These quilts will stay in the greater Louisville area and will be given to children, aged newborn to 18 years of age who are going through long-term medical treatment, may have lost possessions due to a fire or natural disaster, be a victim of abuse or neglect, or having to endure another type of difficult situation.

Project Linus is coined after the blanket-toting character in the Peanuts comics and is a national non-profit organization that offers comfort and security with the gift of new hand-made blankets to children going through a crisis.

Faith Quilters meets the **third Tuesday of every month**, 10:30am-12:30ish in the Social Hall. If you are interested in learning to sew a blanket and this time frame does not work, we have kits of batting, fabric squares, backing, and instructions available.

Those who crochet or knit are encouraged to share your handiwork gift by making a blanket, at least 40" square and up to a full size blanket, in kid-friendly colors and washable fabrics and yarns for the Quilt and Blanket Blessing.

Since the inception of Faith Quilting in 2003, about 670 quilts, blankets, and stuffed animals have been created and donated to area children and nursing home residents. This small group of women has helped many people with their physical and psychological pains through blanket ministry.

## Lent 4.5

### Walking in the footsteps of Jesus

Imagine if the Earth were divided equally among all of us. Each person would receive 4.5 acres. Now imagine that everything you need—food, energy home, clothing, gadgets—must come from those 4.5 acres. But it takes 22.3 acres to maintain the average American lifestyle. There is a new way of observing Lent that helps us care for God's creation by taking steps toward using only our fair share of its resources.

Lent 4.5, developed by the Passionist Earth and Spirit Center, is a 7-week program. It inspires and informs Christian communities on how to use the traditional Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to protect God's creation, bring forth a just society, and nurture a fulfilling spiritual life. It offers practical opportunities for people of faith to apply the values of Gospel simplicity to their everyday lives.

Lent 4.5 will be offered church-wide through pulpit messages, accompanied with bulletin inserts. A Wednesday night group will also gather for those who want to dig deeper, (beginning March 16, 6:30pm, room 113).

# Spiritual Formation

*The Spiritual Formation Team will create environments to help us grow deeper in our journey of knowing and connecting with God.*

## Knowing God

In his work, *Spiritual Exercises*, St. Ignatius developed a method of prayer called the **Examen**. It is designed to help us become aware of and attentive to God's presence and action in our day, become aware of our deepest emotions and to discern God's will for our lives. There are numerous versions of the method but the steps are similar. The steps below are adapted from several sources including The Upper Room website.

- 1) Become aware of God's presence-light a candle, take some deep breaths, breathe in God's love and exhale it to the world around you, "Be still and know that I am God."
- 2) When was I **most** able to give and receive love today? If I could relive one moment, what would it be? Where was I cooperating with God's work in my life?
- 3) When was I **least** able to give and receive love today? What made that moment difficult? When did I feel the life draining out of me? Where was I resisting God's work in my life?
- 4) Give thanks for whatever you have experienced. Take a few deep breaths. Let God's love fill you just as you are. If possible, share these moments with another person.

### New Year, New Habits

#### Proven Family Night Ideas

**Low Impact Outside Games.** Most Children love friendly competition. Play badminton. Croquet is another favorite as well as basketball shooting games like *Horse* or *Around the World* that even the smaller children can enjoy (with a little help).

**Family Service.** Meet in the kitchen to mix up and bake cookies to take to neighbors. Offer to help a neighbor with yard work or babysitting as a family for someone who might need help.

**Hiking or Walking.** Take a family night to walk and talk. Stop along the way to check out trees, little animals and the like. Many areas have such trails; find one close by and head out with your comfortable walking shoes and your family.

**Do Joint Activities.** Consider some occasions when you invite another family to share your family night with you. It could be a multi-family softball or kickball game. A night of Wii or board games. This allows a little broader experience while still being together.

**Consider Craft Projects.** Have a great time making crafts together. Make bird feeders out of 2 liter pop bottles or tie a quilt for a humanitarian project. Through projects like this, children can learn skills and develop an appreciation for nature, for the needs of others, and for the community.

**A Family Production.** Give some thoughts to skits, plays and readers' theaters. Make your own "music video" with a CD of a favorite song, some props and costumes and a little creativity. Children love the make-believe aspects and appreciate being able to role play and work together. Even consider video taping the production for posterity.
