Fusion Youth Mission Tour – June 18-24

Our St. Paul Youth Choir and Sr High Youth are excited to set out on a 7-day tour to NYC. Nineteen youth and fourteen chaperones and staff will depart early on June 18. We have combined our annual trips, and have six different missions we are undertaking along the way:

- Ministering to the Bowery Mission, a shelter for homeless men and haven for those in recovery, during their midday meal and leading worship
- Repacking food items through FOOD BANK NYC at their 90,000 sq ft. warehouse for distribution throughout the metropolitan area
- Serving the homeless at the Holy Apostles Soup Kitchen
- Staffing "Tabitha's Closet," a clothing ministry through The Park UMC (Kerry Thrush's church) near Cincinnati
- Leading worship for Faith UMC, our Pittsburgh area hosts
- Presenting a musical program at the Cathedral of St John the Divine

From the Staff

Looking back at our Lenten journey with *Christian Simplicity-Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus...* What has changed because of this project? Are you changed? Are we, as a church, changed?

I think it is nearly impossible to learn about the ways we are depleting our natural resources and not be different, not feel differently, and not make different decisions as we go about our daily lives.

In talking with folks, I learned that *Lent 4.5*, was received in a variety of ways around St. Paul: Some think why? And why at church? Others mention the information being too overwhelming and stressful to deal with; some view it as a call to action; some can't get enough of the stats and the "what can I do" tips; there are those who wonder if this information is credible; and still others who believe that we don't need to change, instead we need to lift others to our "standard of living."

I look at it this way: If living a simpler life means a more sustainable plan for our planet, our world, and our neighbors near and far, then why not give it a try? For if making more deliberate and intentional decisions about how I spend my time, my energy, my money, and my resources, can make a positive difference both for my life as well as the rest of creation, then why not? As we learned and explored in the *Christian Simplicity* study, simplicity does not equal sacrifice, and simplicity is far from simple. Richard J. Foster very helpfully summarized "controlling principles" in an attempt to offer a current definition of external simplicity. They include: Buy things for their usefulness rather than their status; reject anything producing an addiction in you; develop a habit of giving things away; learn to enjoy things without owning them; develop a deeper appreciation for the creation; look with healthy skepticism at all "buy now, pay later" schemes; reject anything that breeds the oppression of others; obey Jesus' injunction about plain, honest, speech. I have a long way to go toward accomplishing these suggestions, but I have found that even small changes can make a big difference, and those new habits can be contagious!

One of the things I loved about the *Christian Simplicity* course was the prayer services included with each session, particularly the prayer we prayed as the course began:

*O gracious and loving God,
you have blessed our Earth and made all things good.
You have entrusted to us a responsibility
for your creation and all its creatures.
Through our participation in this course,
may we learn to use the created things of Earth
with care, not negligence;
with gratitude, not arrogance;
with simplicity, not excess.
We pray that you would guide us in the way of Jesus. Amen.*

Knowing God

Here we are in the post Easter season. We have completed the liturgical journey from Advent through Lent and Holy Week to the celebration of the Resurrection. Halleluiah! Christ is risen! The message is announced with brass and loud, joyous hymns which we cannot fail to hear. But for Jesus' disciples this post-resurrection time held different messages that were harder to hear and required quiet attention and patience. For the disciples it was a time of questioning, doubt and confusion mixed with glimpses of insight into the full meaning of Jesus' life and death. For Mary at the empty tomb, the disciples on the road to Emmaus, Thomas and the other disciples in the Upper Room and Peter and several others on the shore of the lake, the most important meetings with Jesus were yet to come. On each of these occasions Jesus appeared quietly with no fanfare to individuals or a small group and waited patiently to be recognized. In brief conversations He gradually revealed to them God's great message of love which they had witnessed in his life and death but which they had not been able to understand during his life on earth. Only in reflecting backward on what had occurred were they able to begin to understand their part in the on going story of redemption. Like the disciples, let us not miss the quiet moments of transformation that happen as we reflect backward on God's grace in our lives.

Fifth Sunday Offering

On May 29 St. Paul will take the second *Fifth Sunday* offering this year for the Kentucky United Methodist Homes for Children and Youth. Dr. Donald W. Durham, a Methodist minister who served as Executive Director of the Methodist Home from 1978-1989, died two months ago. Melinda Ryles-Smith, the Home's Vice President of Advancement wrote the following about his ministry there:

"In so many ways, we can see the touch of Dr. Durham today at our Methodist Children's Homes. He built our Versailles Campus School, which is still the largest and finest school at any children's home in the state. He acquired our Mary Kendall Campus in the 1980s so that we could have a presence in western Kentucky. He was the first to envision a treatment program for abused and neglected youth in Kentucky. (Today, ALL children's homes in the state serve as treatment homes.) Dr. Durham realized the need for all Kentucky Children's homes, regardless of religious or secular orientation, to unite in one organization. This organization, The Children's Alliance of Kentucky, coordinates efforts in advocating for at-risk youth in Kentucky. As we celebrate the 140th year of The Kentucky United Methodist Homes for Children and Youth, we also celebrate the legacy of this wonderful man. We could not have made it to this milestone without his vision."

Each *Fifth Sunday* we have an opportunity to assist in the healing ministry which Dr. Durham helped to establish and which countless dedicated people have continued. Let us honor his incentive and their efforts with our gifts for the at-risk children and youth served by our Children's Homes. Thank you for your generous support. The needs of our children

Whether it be on Sunday morning during Sunday School, Sunday evening during KICS, or on Wednesday nights in Kids Klub, I have kept an eye and ear out for the likes and dislikes, concerns and worries, interests and lack thereof of our children here at St. Paul. In doing so, I have become aware of needs that are not being met by the current structure of our Children's program. After much discussion between all parties involved, we have decided to make the following changes effective for the fall of 2011: Kindergarten -3rd grade Sunday School will continue to be the rotation model. Upon Bible presentations in the 4th grade, children will then move to a traditional Sunday School class with an emphasis on learning the Bible. 5th & 6th grade will remain combined for Sunday School and a new ministry for this age will begin, which will include Sunday night groups, lock-ins, retreats and mission opportunities. Upon entering the 7th grade, children will then join the youth group and conclude that year with confirmation. Wesley Nights will follow suit with Wesleyan Choir expanding to include 6th grade. I feel certain that this restructuring will give our children the added support they need to continue the path to and with Christ at this critical time in their lives. -In Christ, Lorie
